4. First-aid Measures

Description of first-aid measures.

General advice.

Move victim to a safe isolated area. When symptoms persist or in all cases of doubt seek medical advice. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

Inhalation.

Move to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if victim is not breathing. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

Skin contact.

Wash off immediately with soap and plenty of water. Remove all contaminated clothes and shoes. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before re-use. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

Eye contact.

Immediately flush with plenty of water. After initial flushing, remove any contact lenses and continue flushing for at least 15 minutes. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

Ingestion.

Do not induce vomiting unless directed to do so by a physician or poison control center. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If swallowed, call a poison control center or doctor immediately.

5. Fire-fighting Measures

Extinguishing media.

Suitable extinguishing media.

Use:. Dry powder. Alcohol-resistant foam. Carbon dioxide (CO₂). Water may be used to cool and prevent the rupture of containers that are exposed to the heat from a fire.

Extinguishing media which shall not be used for safety reasons.

Water may be unsuitable for extinguishing fires.

Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture.

Vapors may travel to areas away from work site before igniting/flashing back to vapor source. Thermal decomposition can lead to release of irritating and toxic gases and vapors. Most vapors are heavier than air. Vapors may spread along ground and collect in low or confined areas (sewers, basements, tanks). Vapors may travel to source of ignition and flash back. Air/vapor mixtures may explode when ignited. Containers may explode when heated.

Advice for firefighters.

Evacuate personnel to safe areas.

As in any fire, wear self-contained breathing apparatus pressure-demand, MSHA/NIOSH (approved or equivalent) and full protective gear.

6. Accidental Release Measures

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures.

Personal precautions.

Avoid contact with skin, eyes and clothing. Ensure adequate ventilation, especially in confined areas. All equipment used when handling the product must be grounded. Eliminate all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks or flames in immediate area). Wear protective gloves/clothing and eye/face protection. Stop all work that requires a naked flame, stop all vehicles, stop all machines and equipment that may cause sparks or flames. Do not breathe vapors or spray mist. Avoid exceeding of the given occupational exposure limits (see section 8). Thoroughly decontaminate all protective equipment after use.

Advice for emergency responders.

Environmental precautions.

Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Do not allow material to contaminate ground water system. Prevent entry into waterways, sewers, basements or confined areas. See Section 12 for additional Ecological information.

Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up.

Methods for Containment.

Absorb with earth, sand or other non-combustible material and transfer to containers for later disposal. Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Pick up and transfer to properly labeled containers. Clean contaminated surface thoroughly. Ground and bond containers when transferring material. Take precautionary measures against static discharges. Use personal protective equipment. Remove all sources of ignition.

Methods for cleaning up.

Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Keep away from open flames, hot surfaces and sources of ignition. Keep in suitable and closed containers for disposal. All equipment used when handling the product must be grounded. Keep combustibles (wood, paper, oil, etc) away from spilled material. Ventilate the area. Use personal protective equipment as required. Shut off ignition sources; including electrical equipment and flames. Clean contaminated objects and areas thoroughly while observing environmental regulations. Never return spills in original containers for re-use.

7. Handling and Storage

Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities.

Advice on safe handling.

Do not pressurize, cut, weld, braze, solder, drill, grind, or expose container to heat, flame, sparks, static electricity, or other sources of ignition. Store in accordance with local regulations. Keep from freezing. Keep away from food, drink and animal feedingstuffs. Keep away from heat, hot surfaces, sparks, open flames and other ignition sources. No smoking.
